Sixth Form students and staff celebrated achieving excellent results for the International Baccalaureate Diploma in 2017.

The global average for the IB is 30 points and this year the girls gained an average of 36 with a third of students achieving 40 or above. These results have secured places on highly competitive courses at universities including Oxford, Durham and Imperial.
