

School Uniform Code

From September 2023

At The Abbey, all students are expected to wear their uniform smartly and with pride. Where specified, uniform must be purchased online from Schoolblazer, our online uniform supplier: www.schoolblazer.com. All items should be named (NB Schoolblazer offers a name-taping service at source), as should all possessions brought to school.

School uniform is an important part of the ethos of the school, bringing together a community of individuals from many different backgrounds, aiding integration, cohesion and good order in the school. If there is any difficulty concerning school uniform, parents should contact the form teacher, tutor, Head of Year (Senior School) or Assistant Head (Junior School), who will always be happy to advise.

Guidance for Junior School and Senior School up to Sixth Form

Hair must be of a natural colour, clean and tidy. For students in the Junior School and Upper III in the Senior School, shoulder length or long hair must be tied back, off the shoulders and back from the face at all times. For all students, hair should be tied back for safety purposes in Science, Art, Food Technology and PE lessons.

Head coverings, when required on religious grounds, are permissible in the Senior School only and must be in plain black fabric. The full face must remain visible and scarves should not fall further than 6 inches below the shoulder.

Only plain studs may be worn by students with pierced ears and they must be removed, or covered with tape, during PE lessons for safety reasons. No other jewellery is permitted, such as necklaces, rings or hoop earrings. Nose piercings, other body piercings and tattoos are also not permitted.

Exceptions may be made for discreet jewellery in line with religious requirements with permission from the Assistant Head (Junior School) or relevant Director (Senior School).

For students up to Lower IV, no makeup or nail varnish is permitted. Students in Upper IV-Upper V may wear clear nail varnish and discreet make-up.

Sixth Form guidance (Years 12-13)

There is no daily school uniform for the Sixth Form: we expect students to wear clothing that is comfortable, sensible and practical for the working environment. We ask that students dress with due regard to their status as the senior members of the school. More specific guidance can be found in the Sixth Form Handbook.

There are no specific regulations regarding jewellery, hair colour or piercings: where there are questions over appropriateness, these will be raised on an individual basis by members of the Sixth Form team. Tattoos are not permitted. In lessons such as Sciences and PE, jewellery should be removed and hair should be tied up for safety purposes.

Protective clothing, clearly marked with your name on the front left side, will be needed for the following classes:

Science: white lab coat or green overall Art: green overall

The Sixth Form has a "Black & White" dress code for formal occasions, which includes leading school assemblies, touring visitors to the school, Speech Day, Open Evening, etc. Students should wear either a smart black dress or black skirt or trousers with a smart white top. Shoes should be clean, comfortable, smart and sensible.

Sixth Form Sportswear

A complete change of clothes is required for PE, Active Enrichment or competitive sport.

Students may wear the school kit from Schoolblazer but this is not compulsory. The PE kitbag should contain:

- Sports top / t-shirt / tracksuit top
- Tracksuit bottoms / shorts / games skirt
- Sport trainers and socks
